Dear families,

We wish everyone best wishes for this Thanksgiving long weekend.

Picture Day is on Tuesday October 13th. Students will be getting their picture taken individually in the gym, then the area will be sanitized after each student. There are no group pictures this year, but **Edge Imaging** will be making composites of the class group.

Please review below a few key messages from our Director of Education, Dr. Jennifer Leclerc.

Important: please self-screen daily!

We remind families that it is extremely important to self-screen for possible symptoms of COVID-19 every morning, before heading to school. Please use the Ontario government's updated, online self-screening tool for this purpose. It will help you make an informed decision about whether you should attend school or child care, consult a health care provider, or get tested for COVID-19.

In addition, we have attached a copy of the self-screening tool for you to print if you choose. Please self-screen every day.

KPR Virtual Elementary School (VES)

With 4,300 students now attending the VES, an intake process has been created to support a successful transition for students and their families. VES students will be able to move from in-person to online learning at the end of each month. This will allow sufficient time for principals and teachers to make the transition as smooth as possible for students.

Parents who would like to move their children from in-school to online learning need to start the process by speaking with the principal of their home school. Families will need to register **by October 23** if they wish their children to make the change on the **next available start date of Monday, November 2.**

Similarly, families who wish their children to switch to online classes on Monday, November 30 will need to register between November 2-20. Please note that this process will not occur in December.

In other words:

To start VES classes on:	Register Between:
Monday, November 2	October 9-23
Monday, November 30	November 2-20

Watch for more information on the transition and registration dates for January.

After registering for the VES and while waiting for their online classes to start, students will be supported by their home school until they transition to the virtual school. They will have two choices during this waiting period: either attend class in person at their home school until the VES start date, or complete work assigned by their child's teacher at home.

Sign up for Text Message Alerts
